Toby's Tickets

Toby has to take the orders for the breakfast meals. He has to write them down quickly so he uses a code for the tickets which he then passes to Mr Millroy. Here is an example. He draws a line to show where each person's meal ends. He also marks the time, which table they are sitting on and how many people are ordering (covers).

The ticket below tells Mr Millroy that there are 2 people on Table 2, one of whom has ordered bacon and a fried egg. The other person wants a sausage and black pudding. They want a tea, a coffee and some brown toast.
