

Why was Amy jealous of Annabelle?




Why did Annabelle have to wait another 6 weeks for her puppy?






The R.S.P.C.A

The R.S.P.C.A. is a charity which helps to prevent cruelty to animals and rescues animals which are in danger. R.S.P.C.A. stands for 'The Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals. All the work they do is funded by charity.

Every day they find homes for 130 rescued animals. It can cost up to $\pounds 200$ to adopt a dog but they come with a microchip and all its vaccinations to keep it healthy. It will also have had an operation that means it wont be able to have any puppies itself.


Guide Dogs

The smallest dog ever recorded was a Yorkshire Terrier. When it was fully grown it was only 6.3 cm tall at the shoulder and was only 9.5 cm from the tip of its nose to the end of his body. The largest dog ever recorded was an English Mastiff from its nose to the end of its tail it was two and a half metres long! The tallest dog ever recorded was a Great Dane it was 106 cm tall at the shoulder.




Greyfriars Bobbie
