Donkeys are very intelligent animals. They have an incredible memory and can remember other donkeys or animals for up to 25 years. Donkeys are also surprisingly strong - stronger than horses of a similar size. Because of their strength, donkeys have long been used by man as work animals. In some parts of the world, families would struggle to survive without their donkeys which help them to carry heavy loads of water, fuel and food to and from their homes. It is because of this that the donkey has become known as a "beast of burden".

Why has the donkey become known as a "beast of burden?

Donkeys have a reputation for being stubborn - it is very difficult to make a donkey do something if it doesn't want to. However, this is because donkeys are very good at sensing when there is danger. If a donkey sensed that there was danger round the corner, then it would dig its heels in and flatly refuse to move in that direction.

In the wild, donkeys eat a mixture of grasses, bark and leaves. They can survive on very little food and water because of their body's natural ability to cope in hot, dry areas such as deserts. In captivity, donkeys are usually fed on hay and straw. Donkeys love to eat lush, green grass and, if allowed, will often eat more than is good for them. Donkey owners need to make sure that this does not happen.


# The Donkey in Lion's Skin

It covered him from head to foot. The donkey found a pool and looked at his reflection.


"I look magnificent," he said.
